



We will settle for nothing less than excellence in our drive for achievement wherever this can be found.




Why choose Palmers Cross Primary?

We provide this with a well planned, balanced and differentiated curriculum within a caring, safe and secure yet enquiring environment.









Characteristics of Effective Learning	
	Playing and Exploring - Engagement <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Finding out and exploring• Playing with what I know• Being willing to 'have a go'
	Active Learning - Motivation <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Being involved and concentrating• Keeping trying• Enjoying achieving what I set out to do
	Creating and Thinking Critically - Thinking <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Having my own ideas• Making links• Choosing ways to do things



The characteristics of effective learning describe factors which play a central role in a pupil's learning and in becoming an effective learner. They are vital elements of support for the transition process from EYFS to year 1. The characteristics of effective learning run through and underpin all 7 areas of learning and development. They represent processes rather than outcomes.

Information about the pupil's characteristics of effective learning gives year 1 teachers vital background and context about their next stage of development and future learning needs.


Assessment of Learning in Reception

- ▶ Governments baselines during first half term completed with class teacher. Simple tasks completed under observation assessed against the development bands.
- ▶ Throughout Reception, as part of the learning and teaching process, each child's development is regularly assessed against Early Learning Goals and developmental age bands across the seven areas.
- ▶ The assessments are based on observations by the Reception team, knowledge of the whole child and discussions with parents. This is placed in the Teacher's Assessment file. Examples and steps of the children's learning is gathered together within key subject areas to create their own 'Learning Journey'.



- ▶ There are three parents consultation evenings throughout the year but please feel free to speak to us at any time if you have any queries.





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
Admissions into Reception

If your child was born between 1/9/2017 and 31/8/2018 you must apply for a place in Reception Year before the 15th January 2022.

Admissions Timeline

- ❑ November 2021 - Online admissions applications go live and hard copies are available from the council on request.


Parents are invited to name up to 5 preferred schools, ranked in order of preference.

- ❑ 15th January 2022 23:59 - Application deadline

- ❑ 15th April 2022 - Allocation Day

Parents who made applications online will be able to view their school allocation via the online admissions facility. Admissions will write to every applicant resident in Wolverhampton with notification of their allocated place.

- ❑ Parents will be required to respond to Wolverhampton City Council to any offers made within 10 working days.
