

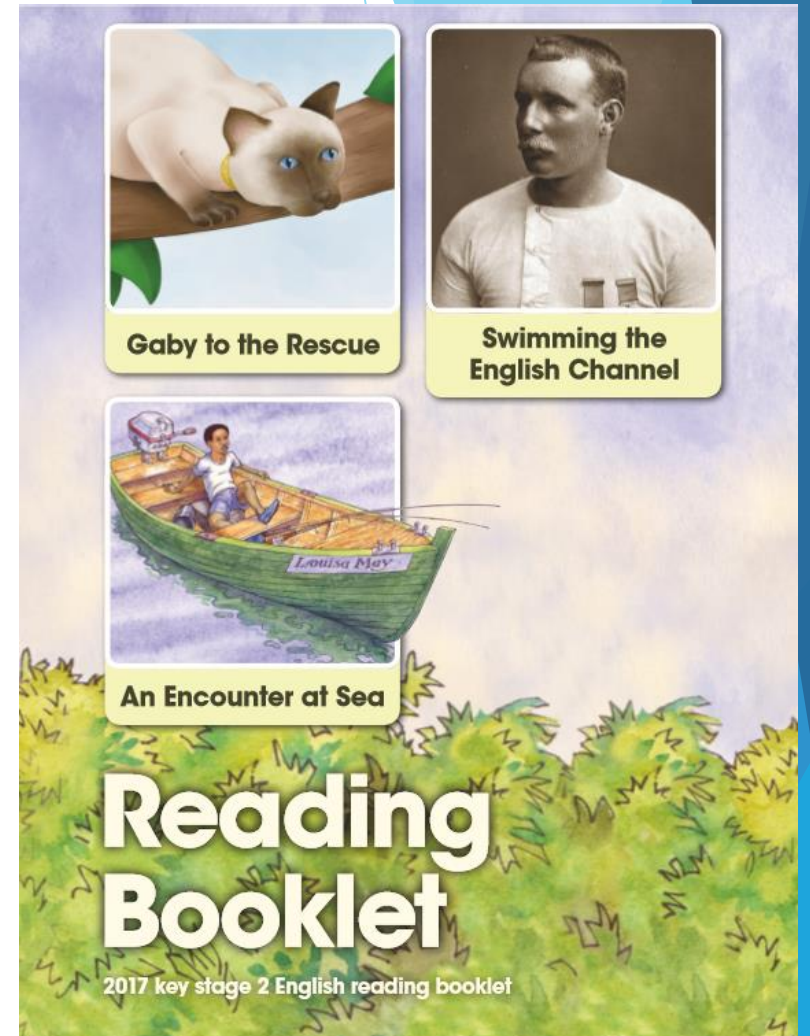

Reading

- ▶ 1 hour test
- ▶ 3 texts to read
- ▶ Approximately 36 questions to answer
- ▶ Closed questions - retrieve from the text
- ▶ Open questions - why or explain further



In school

- ▶ Guided reading sessions
- ▶ Whole class reading
- ▶ ERIC time - every child reading in class
- ▶ Competition in class
- ▶ Past papers

At home

- ▶ Reading at least 3 x a week at home to someone
- ▶ Read a range of books
- ▶ Visit to the library
- ▶ Working through corrections from past papers

Writing

- ▶ Teacher assessed throughout the year
- ▶ Writing expectations to achieve
- ▶ Termly writing moderation
- ▶ External moderation
- ▶ All pupils require a range of writing

- ▶ Paper 2 - 20 word spelling test
- ▶ Paper 1 - focus on punctuation and grammar questions




