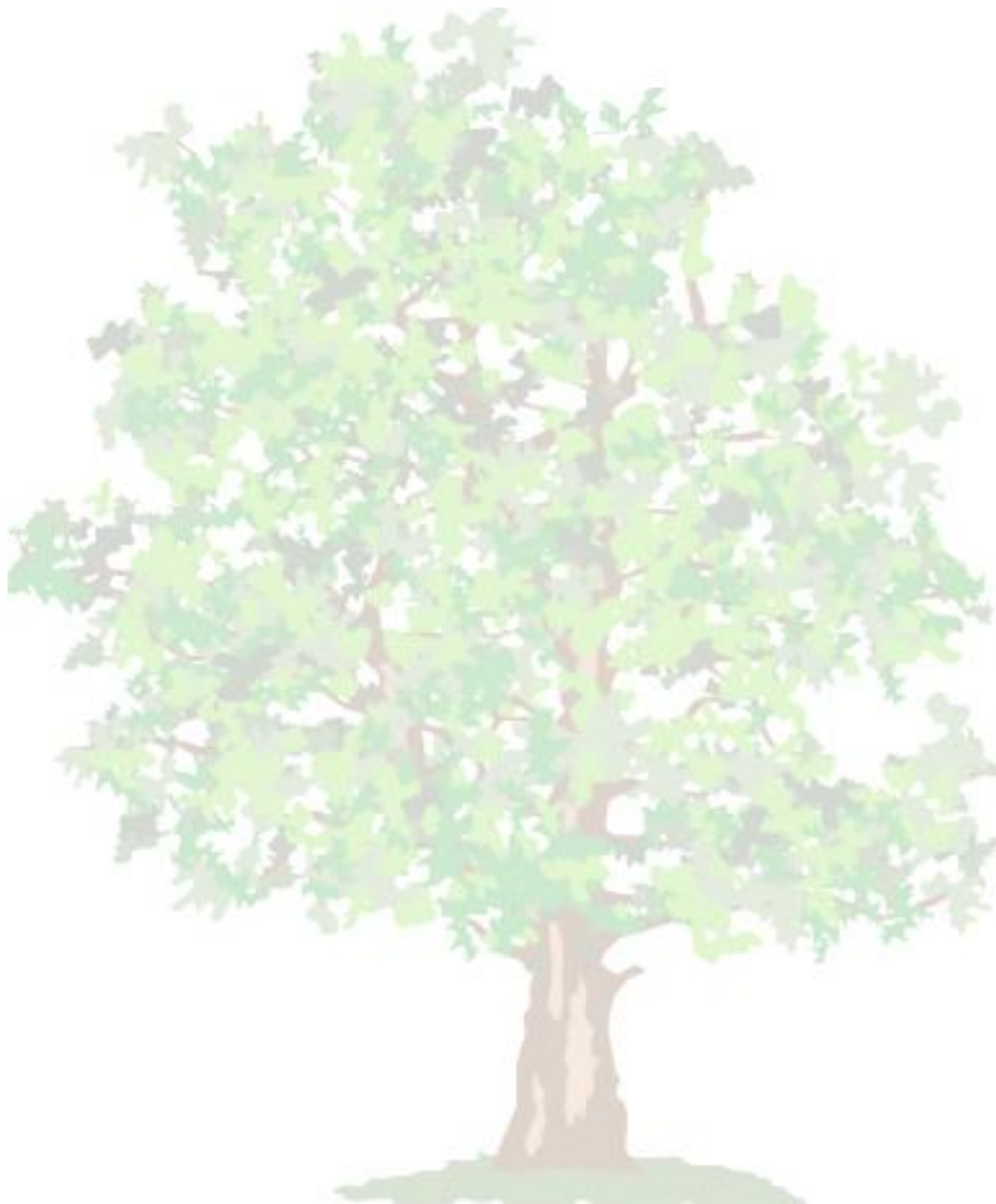




Homework will still be given out on a Friday, with tasks alternating between Maths, English and Science. Pupils will need to continue completing reading journal activities, to develop their comprehension, and practising spellings.



Thematic Topic

Class 3 will be travelling across the world in our new unit, "Picture Our Planet" - a thematic unit with a key focus on geography. Learning is centred around three contrasting localities: - Brazil, Scotland, and Fiji, and includes key facts, physical and human features, traditions and customs and an insight into how each country is tackling conservation issues. We will be looking at a range of sources and evidence and making comparisons.

PE

In PE, pupils will be learning, and performing dances with control and expression; PE sessions will still take place on a Wednesday and Thursday normal. As we are approaching the warmer months, please ensure that pupils have the appropriate kit and suncream (if necessary). PE kit is still available to purchase from the office.

Music

Class 3 will continue to receive music tuition on a Monday, throughout the summer term. Pupils will continue to develop their ukelele skills, learning new chords and pieces of music, in preparation for their summer concert. Ukeleles will continue to be taken home after music on a Monday afternoon.

RE

This term, in RE we will complete our Sikhism unit. The children will then recap their learning of all the religions we have learnt about throughout the year.

Summer Term Overview



Maths

We will begin the summer term by focusing on column subtraction, building on prior learning and progressing to subtracting 3-digit numbers, including exchanging from hundreds to tens. Once pupils are secure in this, we will move on to learning the 2, 4, and 8 times tables, before exploring both unit and non-unit fractions. To finish the summer term, Class 3 will study geometry, learning about parallel and perpendicular sides in polygons, as well as developing their understanding of time.

English

In English, the children will continue to develop on and apply taught features in a range of genres, including persuasive writing, fiction recounts and non-fiction. The pupils will be encouraged to edit and improve their work, apply a variety of SPaG and language features, including conjunctions, prepositional phrases and descriptive language. Spellings will still be given out weekly on a Monday, with tests taking place on the following Monday.

Science

In Science, Year 3 will be finishing their unit on *Plants*. During this unit, pupils will learn about the different parts of a plant, dissect a flowering plant, explore how water is transported within plants, and study the life cycle of a flowering plant.
