Parent View Results and Actions

Summer 2023

- The survey was completed online over April and May 2023
- 94 families responded to the survey (at the time of the survey, there were approximately 230 pupils on roll from Nursery – Year 6)
- More than 90% of parents agree or strongly agree that:
 - Their child is happy at school
 - Their child feels safe at school
 - The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved
 - My child does well at this school
 - The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year
 - The school has high expectations for my child

What we do currently

Teachers set end of year targets on a yearly basis using key data
 Senior leaders challenge teachers to ensure targets are appropriate
 Termly meetings with teachers to analyse target data
 Pupil books are monitored on a half termly basis providing teachers and pupils with feedback
 Teachers have continual professional development in questioning for higher level thinking
 Pupil voice is collected on a yearly basis
 Weekly homework is set including phonics and spellings

Further actions we can take

Increased opportunities for pupil voices with senior leaders and governors gathering responses
 Continue to offer parent workshops to inform them how to challenge and work on pupil targets
 Continue to provide teachers and teaching assistants with professional development to ensure standards continue to increase.
